

Academic Leveling

Academic leveling helps learners succeed with their business programs by providing foundational knowledge and skills in a broad range of business education topic areas. Academic leveling also provides non-business majors, or learners needing to refresh their knowledge, with the necessary business education fundamentals to complete undergraduate or advanced degrees.

Academic leveling is typically conducted within the first course(s) in the curriculum to assess whether prerequisite requirements have been met and, where appropriate, provide the course work necessary to address any gaps.



Solutions

Customized, Individually Selected Modules. Learners complete the modules sequentially and each module has a pre-test and post-test. School officials can require that learners achieve a score of 80% or higher on the post-test. Learners can re-take the post-test once. Learners can upload their module completion certificate to the course's LMS. The post-test score can automatically post to the LMS using LTI integration. This option works best if the intent is to use the modules within a course as weekly assignments with formative assessment based on the post-test results. The total number of learner hours depends on the number of modules selected.

A Survey of Business. Learners complete individual modules as one larger course pack without the module-specific pre-tests and post-tests. The course pack concludes with a comprehensive final exam based on all the individual modules. School officials can require a score of 80% or higher on the final exam and the score can be posted back to the course LMS. The instructor could also substitute or augment the final exam with a paper requirement, a paper related to business integration. This option works best for academic leveling conducted as independent, but required, study, where the goal is proof of completion with summative assessment. This option is available as A Survey of Business Module and includes approximately 70-80 learner hours.

Advanced Leveling. Learners complete the business-related skills modules (16 CPC-based modules) along with OneDay: Business Strategy Simulation and modules related to leadership. Summative assessment for this option is based on Peregrine's Critical Thinking Assessment Exam where learners are presented with five Critical Thinking assessment items. Each assessment includes 10 questions based on a short case study. This option works best for advanced academic leveling where the goal is to level the learner to the business curriculum and develop business integration, strategy, and leadership competencies. This course pack has approximately 125-135 learner hours.
